## <u>Elementary Speaking Assessments through Project-Based Learning - MATSOL</u> 2018

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With the increased emphasis on <u>oral language</u> and <u>academic discourse</u>, ELLs need <u>meaningful opportunities to practice</u> <u>speaking with real connections</u> to the deep learning they are doing.
