

International Women's Day IS a day to honor AND praise women for their accomplishments. In some COUNTRIES such as China, Russia and Zambia, IT is an official holiday. In OTHER countries, such as Chile, Romania, and THE United States, it is not a PUBLIC holiday, but people celebrate IT. Some WOMEN, such as Mother Teresa from Calcutta, India, receive HONORS for their work with the poor. Others such as San Suu Kyi or Burma and Wangari Maathi FROM Kenya, ARE honored for their work to make their COUNTRY'S government serve its PEOPLE better. Over the years SOME progress has been made in MANY parts of the world but women still have a long WAY to go.

Script for I've Always Wanted to be a Nurse (Pair)

I've wanted to be a nurse since I was a little girl. I used to put bandages on my dolls. I know that nursing isn't for everyone but everyday I feel like I'm making a difference. It's great to see someone get well.

However it can be very stressful at times. Also I've often had to work nights, weekends and holidays.

But I've been a nurse for 25 years. I've loved working in pediatrics and surgery. I can't see myself doing anything else.
