Strategies for Welcoming Newcomers

As a specialist...

- use songs that teach vocabulary and/or use actions
- start every lesson with a greeting (don't be afraid to repeat these again and again!)
- use visuals and realia
- have students do an "About Me" project, poster, presentation, etc.
- have students draw to communicate
- collaborate with classroom teachers as much as possible
- observe newcomers in their mainstream classes to gather information for yourself and the classroom teacher

As a classroom teacher...

- include ELL students in all classroom activities
- assign a buddy to new students (better if the buddy speaks the same language as the student)
- have students show what they know, even if they have to draw or act out an answer
- make use of your district's technology--even if the technology is at another school or for another level
- advocate for your students
 - Students may need reading support or other support in addition to ESL
- select vocabulary words that will help ELL students across the curriculum
- make your class a family--all students should feel welcome!
