How to Practice Shadowing at Home to Improve Your Pronunciation

	<p>1. Look in your book. Find a short listening from the audio CD that sounds natural to you and one that includes the words. Often you can find the audio script for the listening at the back of your book.</p>
	<p>2. Listen to the recording without looking at the words.</p>
	<p>3. Listen again, reading along with the speaker.</p>
	<p>4. Listen again and read along. <u>Underline</u> or highlight the strong (stressed) words.</p>
	<p>5. Listen again. Practice listening to the audio recording while you practice speaking at the same time, keeping up with the speaker. Try to match the speaker's voice.</p>

Using headphones will make it a little easier to follow the speaker, but it's not necessary.

If you use your phone or any other recording device to record yourself speaking along with the audio, you can listen to your recording and see how you did. If not, ask someone to listen to you and tell you how you did.
