<b>10</b>	The Overall Score represents the proportion of words and phrases that are likely to be understood by a typical native speaker of English, who is unfamiliar with the speaker, in spontaneous conversation. This score is comprised of a weighted combination of all subscores and is a measure of the speaker's ability to communicate effectively.

### SUB SCORES

CATEGORY	RESULT	DESCRIPTION
PHONETICS	7.4	The Phonetic Index subscore is a measurement of how accurately the speaker produces specific acoustical sounds that if mispronounced may change the interpreted meaning of the words and phrases spoken.
COARTICULATION	7.5	Coarticulation measures how well the speaker combines certain vowel consonant combinations within a specific phrasing and pronunciation context.
FLUENCY	7.2	Fluency refers to the smoothness of voicing drawing inferences from both voiced periods and periods of rest. Unanticipated interruptions and pauses lower this score.
ENUNCIATION	7.1	Enunciation is a measurement of the clarity of speech and measures how close the speaker's pronunciation is relative to that of a native speaker of American English.
PROSODY	7.1	Prosody is a measure of the cadence or "rhythm" of the speaker's voice. This measure combines the measures of enunciation and fluency.
